

**PUBLIC NOTICE**  
**TOWN OF MONCK'S CORNER**  
**GENERAL ELECTION 2017**

The Board of Voter Registration and Elections of Berkeley County announces the General Election for the **Town of Moncks Corner** to be Tuesday the 7th day of November, 2017.

The following offices shall be included in this election:

Three (3) Town Council Seats  
Commissioner of Public Works

Any person wishing to file as a candidate for the above listed offices may do so by bringing the filing fee of \$100.00 (one hundred) for Council and \$100 (one hundred) for Public Works to the Berkeley County Elections office. This office is located at 6 Belt Drive, Moncks Corner, SC 29461. Books will be open for filing August 1, 2017 at noon, and will remain open during regular business hours until August 15, 2017 at **NOON**.

The dates of filing are **August 1 – August 15, 2017**.

Council seats are for a four (4) year term, expiring December 2021. Commission of Public Works is a six (6) year term, expiring December 2023.

The polling place for this election will be Moncks Corner Town Hall, 118 Carolina Avenue, Moncks Corner, SC 29461, as set by law.

People desiring to vote in the upcoming election must be registered by October 7, 2017. To register, one must contact the Board of Voter Registration & Elections of Berkeley County.

Registered electors who cannot vote in person may be eligible to vote by absentee ballot. Voters wishing for more information concerning absentee voting should contact The Berkeley County Elections & Registration Office.

This is a nonpartisan election and no party affiliation shall be placed on the ballot.

The polls shall open at 7:00 AM on Election Day and close at 7:00 PM.

At 9:00 AM on Election Day the Board of Voter Registration & Elections of Berkeley County shall begin the process of examining the absentee ballots. This examination will be held at the County Elections Office, 6 Belt Drive, Moncks Corner, SC 29461.

On Thursday, the 9th of November at 10:00 AM the Board of Voter Registration and Elections of Berkeley County will hold a hearing to determine the validity of ballots challenged in this election.
